A Letter to Tom and Kathy Schaefer, Opal Wolfgang, and Gary Puckett

2 Chronicles 7:14-16 says “If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land.”

I called on and I prayed to Jesus for useful employment that was in His will for my life. Church of God campground manager, Kathy Schaefer, verified with board members to hire my assistance on the campground under Tom and Kathy’s leadership. This position on the surface is simply sweat equity, such as scrubbing toilets, sanitizing showers and bathrooms, cleaning cabins, washing laundry, fluff and fold, restocking all supplies, ordering and purchasing, mopping and dusting, window washing, painting, landscaping and weeding, phone answering, and scheduling proper placement for tenants and campers. That’s just this newbie’s simple version of assisting Tom and Kathy. The greater, grand truth is how amazingly under the radar their help’s ministry is. See, these so-called groundkeepers and managers are on call hourly by the general public and not just Christian folks. Pipeline employees, windmill workers, homeless, Midland flood victims, displaced COVID-19 rambler, and the weekend temporary vacationers. They, with God’s grace and a lot of experience, maintain vital relationships to conduct our open camping progress here at St. Louis. Tom and Kathy have endured the sharp sting of being placed on the calling and responsibility of Church of God groundkeepers and managers, immediately following months of shelter-in-place for a global pandemic health protocol. While everyone else is catching up on their months of missed appointments—doctors, eye exams, vet clinics—family get-togethers, vacations, and then American privileges resuming once again with a mask, Tom and Kathy faithfully forgo personal agendas and set the pace for forward mobility on solid ground here at our church camp in St. Louis. They are committed to helping by following through their commitment to God first! Our local community donates to our campground, because, by word of mouth, people have benefitted from this campground’s extended willingness to meet a need. I will repeat that God is a god that restores, refreshes, renews, rejoices, and resurrects. Tom and Kathy serve a mighty God, and it’s a privilege to be here on God’s campground in St. Louis, Michigan.

1 Peter 4:8-11 says, “And above all things, have fervent love for one another, for ‘love will cover a multitude of sin’. Be hospitable to one another without grumbling.
