Plan to drop off your children no earlier than 15 minutes before service and pick them up no later than 15 minutes following service.

# **Our Evangelist & Worship Leader**

### Rev. Mitchell Burch, Camp Evangelist



Mitchell began his ministry as a high school student and has been in Christian Ministry for 48 years. His ministry has taken him across the US and to many other countries around the world preaching on five continents. His passion for preaching the Word and communicating the Gospel motivates him as he serves in the Kingdom.

Pastor Mitch grew up in Buffalo, West Virginia in a pastors home. Born the youngest of two sons to Rev. Wayne and Gloria Burch. After high school where in excelled in

three different sports he attended Gulf Coast Bible College in Houston, TX. After leaving college he became the Associate Pastor at Jones Church of God in Oak Hill, WV. After three years he took his first Senior pastorate in Morehead, KY. Since 1983 he has served three large churches in Cincinnati, Ohio, Vancouver, Washington and Middletown, Ohio. Currently he serves as State Pastor for West Virginia Ministries of the Church of God and as Senior Pastor of his home church, the Buffalo Church of God. Pastor Mitch is also the owner and manager of the Townesmen Quartet who have been singing Southern Gospel Music for over 62 years. For the last 15 years The Townesmen have traveled around the country sharing the Love of Christ in the ministry of music. He also currently serves as Assistant Coach for the Buffalo High School Varsity Girls Basketball program.

Pastor Mitch graduated from International Bible College and Seminary with a bachelor's degree in Bible Theology and from the Beeson Institute of Leadership at Asbury. He has continued his studies at Southern Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. Pastor has his certification in the areas of Church Health and Growth, Stewardship Development and a Leadership Coaching.

Pastor Mitch is married to Missy Burch and they have three adult children and five grandchildren.

### Rev. Jeff Eckman, Worship Leader

Pastor Jeff Eckman grew up in Pinckney, MI, and attended the Wright's Corners Church of God (Now the Crossroads Church of God). The registration office is open daily from 8:00 a.m-6:30 p.m. & after evening services. It will be closed during conferences, services and the annual business meeting. The Treasurer will be in the office one hour before and after evening services.

# CAMP ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY

### **REGISTRATION AND INFORMATION**

Upon arrival, everyone should go to the Registration office and register. **All campers** (trailers, tents, cottages, cabins, and dorms) **must register** before camping. Information and mail service will be handled at the Registration Building.

### **VEHICLE REGULATIONS**

Motorcycles, bicycles, mopeds, cars, trucks, golf carts, and all motorized vehicles shall be restricted to roadways and driven at a **maximum of 5mph**. **Drivers must have a valid drivers license**. Designated Handicap areas for parking are to be observed and obeyed. Only one vehicle may be parked on your campsite. There are designated parking areas for all other vehicles.

### **RULES OF CONDUCT**

- The use of tobacco, marijuana, vaping, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, promiscuous sex, profanity, and distribution of any literature (not approved by the Board of Directors) is strictly forbidden.
- No unauthorized sales of merchandise on the grounds without approval from the Board of Directors.

### REGULATIONS CONCERNING DRESS CODE- OBSERVANCE OF QUIET HOUR

Rules and regulations are meaningless unless those to whom the rules and regulations apply abide by them. Thus, this is an appeal to every camper, adult and youth, who will be attending the St. Louis Camp Meeting, to consider these rules concerning dress and quiet time and govern their actions by same.

**DRESS:** In as much as this is a Christian camp, all persons should be appropriately dressed as becomes a Christian. Shirts and footwear in buildings are required and no short shorts allowed. (Short Shorts: Arms at your side. Hands pointing to the ground. Anything above your fingertips are short shorts!)

**QUIET HOUR:** 11:00 p.m. Everyone should respect the desires of others to have quiet for sleeping at this hour and restrict their activities after this hour. At midnight the grounds will be secured.

### REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHAPERONES

- Each youth/minor staying on the grounds must register at the Registration Window along with chaperone. The adult chaperones must be on the grounds as long as the minor is present.
- The chaperone must be approved by the local church and/or the campground manager. This person shall be responsible for the actions of those in his/her charge.
- All young people under 18 yrs. of age must sleep in the same immediate area as their chaperone, be it at
  a camp site, in a dorm, cottage, or cabin.
- The chaperone must complete and sign the "Chaperone's Covenant" to be placed on file at the Registration Office.

### **CAMP FIRES**

Camp fires at the sites will be allowed this year, with burning wood ONLY, no trash! Think of your neighbors-be considerate in the placement of your fire site. Fire rings can be requested at registration.

### BICYCLE, TRICYCLES, UNICYCLES, SKATEBOARDS AND LONG BOARD GUIDELINES

- Bicycles, tricycles, unicycles, skateboards, and long boards may only be ridden on camp roadways, and on
  the sidewalks north of the lacing tables and must obey all signs and speed limits posted on the grounds.
- The above vehicles are not allowed on sidewalks, in children's area, or the prayer garden.
- Do not block access to any building such as the restrooms.
- They must be locked/on a camper's lot when not being ridden.
- St. Louis Campgrounds is not liable for any injury involving a bicycle, tricycle, unicycle, skateboard, or long board or for loss of property.
- St. Louis Campgrounds is asking parents or guardians to be responsible for enforcing these guidelines. If
  the campground needs to step in, there will be a verbal warning for the first incident. If more warnings
  are required you may be asked to remove the tricycle, bicycle, unicycle, skateboard, or long board from
  the grounds.

### PET POLICY


- Anyone having pets must register them when checking in and agree to adhere to the following pet policy statement.
- There is a maximum of 2 pets per campsite.
- All pets must be kept in the trailer when no one is at the campsite.
- There will be a designated pet walking area on both the north and south side of the campground.
- Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets.
- All pets must have a collar and be on a 6' leash when outside of the trailer.
- All pets must be up to date on all their shots and have tags.
- Owners are expected to keep control of their pets. If there is excessive noise or aggressive behavior by
  the pet, the owner will be asked to remove their pet from the premises immediately. The owner may
  return to camp, but the pet will no longer be allowed to stay.
